

# SAN JUAN

San Juan, the largest city and capital of Puerto Rico serves as one of its most important seaports and is the island's manufacturing, financial, cultural, and tourism centre. San Juan has a current population of 437,745 people and is constantly growing.

San Juan is an architectural delight framed by two imposing structures: San Felipe del Morro, the oldest fortress still standing in the New World - and Castillo San Cristóbal, a fort built in 1634 to protect the Spaniards against land based attacks. Between them is a grid of narrow cobbled streets lined with pastel-coloured houses adorned with wood balconies.

Must-sees in San Juan are La Fortaleza, the governor's mansion; La Alcadia (city hall); San José Church, one of the few Gothic-style cathedrals in the Caribbean; El Convento Dominicano, a former convent that is now a cultural center; and Casa Blanca, built to house the family of Puerto Rico's discoverer, Ponce de León.

There may be no better way to enjoy the heart of San Juan than by simply wandering its narrow lanes in the evening to discover what lies around the next corner. It might be a tiny bar where you can sip a cool cocktail, or an open-air café serving a rich espresso. You might discover a garden in the patio of a grand old colonial building, browse an art gallery, or people-watch in one of the many plazas. Dance the night away in Plaza San José or enjoy a slightly more peaceful time at Plaza Colón, which is also the site of a famous statue of Christopher Columbus.

Whether you are there to explore the rich culture and history, the many boutique shops and malls or just to relax and unwind on one of its beautiful tropical beaches, San Juan is sure to impress.

# **BUENOS AIRES**

Buenos Aires, the capital and largest city of Argentina is currently the third-largest metropolitan area in South America with a population of close to 13 million people. Strongly influenced by European culture, Buenos Aires is often referred to as the "Paris of South America"

Despite its European connections, Buenos Aires has a flavour all its own. Street performers doing the tango are as much a part of the landscape as famous buildings like the opulent, French-designed Teatro Colón. Local culture is celebrated in the weekly Mataderos Fair, featuring regional food, crafts and horse races.

Plaza de Mayo is a must-see for anyone who visits Buenos Aires. Several of the city's major landmarks are located around the Plaza: the Cabildo (the city council during the colonial era), the Casa Rosada (home of the executive branch of the federal government), the Metropolitan Cathedral of Buenos Aires and the May Pyramid.

A frequently visited area south of the city is San Telmo, with its cobblestone streets and buildings from the colonial era that attest to its long history. There are churches, museums, antique shops and antique fairs ('Ferias de Antigüedades') in historic Dorrego Square, where the streets on weekends are filled with performers such as tango dancers.

With a tremendous culture, both slow-paced and passionate, and so many sights and attractions, Buenos Aires is a city of captivating complexity and irresistible beauty.
